2008 has been a great year for Stop the Toad. We held our third annual Great Toad Muster for four weeks in September and October. It was our most successful Muster with almost 70,000 cane toads being removed from the invading population heading towards Western Australia.

We couldn't have done it without the support of our donors or volunteers. A total of 70 volunteers from all over Australia and overseas attended this years Muster. A heartfelt thankyou to you all.

In November, we were granted \$150,000 under the Federal Caring For Our Country Grants scheme. This grant will allow us to hold the 2009 Great Toad Muster on a bigger scale and to initiate a National cane toad Eradication Week (NEW).

On the 22nd December, cane toads were found 16kms from the border of W.A. Now, more than ever, time is of the essence. We look forward to continuing the fight against this pest and keeping them out of W.A. with you all in 2009.
