Freaky Facts

Cane toads are native to Central and South America. The density of the cane toad within its native distribution is significantly lower than that of its introduced distribution. In South America, it is recorded at densities of 20 adults per 100 metres, but in Australia the density reaches 1,000-2,000 adults over the same area!
